

FROM PASTOR JORDAN'S DESK

Greetings,

It is my hope and prayer you are all doing well!

If we were to look at the news today, we would be overwhelmed with the state of things. War, famine, division, and chaos. Not just in our own country, but around the world. It feels as though more than ever, the world has been turned upside down. It can be hard to know where or how to start. How can we, as followers of God make a difference in a world that is filled with hurt, division, hate, and anger?

The best place to start is to pray. Now, we might be wondering, "Pastor Jordan, with so much going on in our country, and around the world, how do we even begin to pray for all of that?"

I get it. It can be hard to know what to pray for. If we were to make a list of everything we needed or wanted to pray for...well, the list would be quite long.

One of the simplest ways we can begin is by turning to what are called, breath prayers. These prayers are short and flow from the rhythm of our breathing. In Hebrew and Greek, the words used to describe God's Spirit mean "breath" or "spirit". Breath prayers were recorded as early as the 3rd to 4th centuries in Egypt with our Christian Desert Mothers and Fathers.

Breath prayers can anchor us when we are anxious, overwhelmed, or are just wanting to start somewhere. At this point, we might be thinking...how does this work?

It's quite simple. As we breathe in, we may choose a Bible verse or a phrase to pray silently. Then as we breathe out, we pray the second part.

For example, a breath prayer I have been praying when feeling overwhelmed has been:

(Breathe In): I'm ok,

(Breathe Out): God's got me.

Other examples might be:

(Breathe In): Lord in your mercy, (Breathe Out): hear my prayer.

(Breathe In): The Lord is my Shepherd, (Breathe Out): I shall not want.

The beauty of breath prayers is that they can be as unique as each of us as they can beshaped to focus on what we might need as individuals, as a church, or as a country. All that is required is breathing. When we have a desire to pray but have no idea where to start...take a breath and allow God's Spirit to fill us and breathe out our worries.

Breathe in...and breathe out.
